PRECEDENTS.

Another thing that Surrealist ideology affected was our approach towards **literature**. One such change in ideology is what caused a disagreement between two surrealists, **Andre Breton and Raymond Queneau** on experimental literature.

OULIPO

Ouvroir de Littérature Potentielle. Workshop of Potential Literature.



Founded in 1960 by French mathematician **Francois de Lionnais** and writer **Raymond Queneau**, *OULIPO* investigates the possibilities of verse written under a system of structural constraints with a formula for each work.



This technique involves taking a poem or piece of writing that already exists, and substituting **each noun** with the one that occurs **seven nouns away** in the dictionary.

Based on the **dictionary** used, this technique can have very different outcomes.
